Aug. 21	VIEWMONT	W	28-8
	<p>QBs Ty Hannay and Stefan Cantwell alternated, and combined to pass for two touchdowns and run for two more as Bingham handled Viewmont. DB Braden Anderson broke a school record with three interceptions. The Miners' defense didn't give up a point, limiting Viewmont to just 175 yards of offense.</p>		
Aug. 28	ALTA	W	38-34
	<p>RB Harvey Langi put on a show, running for 189 yards, and adding 116 receiving, as Bingham did what it hadn't been able to do in past games with Alta – win the fourth quarter. The Miners ended a three-game losing streak to the Hawks by outscoring them 24-7 in the second half to earn the win.</p>		
Sept. 7	at Trinity, Texas	L	21-42
	<p>RB Tevin Williams rushed for 211 yards and two touchdowns, and Trinity took advantage of a couple of Bingham turnovers and several costly penalties to claim an impressive win at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium.</p>		
Sept. 11	AMERICAN FORK	W	41-14
	<p>Harvey Langi rushed for 100 yards, but it was Bingham's defense, which stopped American Fork on five straight drives and then inside the 1-yard line. That momentum allowed the Miners to take the non-region win.</p>		
Sept. 18	at Cottonwood	W	45-29
	<p>Braden Anderson returned the second-half kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown, and later picked up a fumble and rambled 70 yards that set up another score, as Bingham turned back Cottonwood in its final non-region game.</p>		
Sept. 24	at Kearns*	W	47-13
	<p>Harvey Langi rushed for a season-high 152 yards and three touchdowns, and Braden Anderson returned a kick for a score for the second straight week as Bingham dominated</p>		
Sept. 30	COPPER HILLS*	W	50-7
	<p>Harvey Langi and Richie Vakapuna carried the offense's rushing attack, which accounted for 312 yards, and the defense was its usual self, shutting down Copper Hills.</p>

Oct. 9	at West Jordan*	W	41-7
	Harvey Langi rushed for 127 yards and scored three touchdowns and Manoa Pikula returned an interception 52 yards for a score as Bingham won again. The Miners' defense was only rarely tested against the Jaguars' freshman QB.		
Oct. 16	RIVERTON*	W	35-7
	On a cool homecoming night, Harvey Langi rushed for 122 yards and scored two touchdowns, but Bingham's defense stole the show. Kamron Coon made the game's big play with a 28-yard interception return for a score.		
Oct. 22	at Taylorsville*	W	45-7
	RB Richie Vakapuna rushed for 102 yards, and the Bingham defense intercepted four Taylorsville passes, returning two of them for touchdowns, en route to an easy victory that clinched first place and a top seed going into the 5A playoffs.		
Oct. 31	JORDAN#	W	62-42
	Harvey Langi rushed for 159 yards and Richie Vakapuna had 107 as Bingham ran into a big lead and finally outlasted Jordan in the first round of the 5A playoffs. Afterward, Langi said it was the longest game he could remember.		
Nov. 6	SYRACUSE#	W	38-3
	Harvey Langi rushed for 159 yards, and Jake Bright blocked a punt on the last play of the second quarter that Kamron Coon recovered for a score. That turned out to be the big play as Bingham went on to whip Syracuse in a 5A quarterfinal game.		
Nov. 12	vs. Alta#	W	28-19
	RB Harvey Langi led a balanced attack, and the Bingham defense dominated the line of scrimmage, but it still took a couple of trick plays for the Miners to hold off Alta and advance to the 5A championship game.		
Nov. 19	vs. Davis#	W	35-24
	Stefan Cantwell ran for 178 yards and four touchdowns as Brighton rallied from a 17-7 halftime deficit to beat Davis and capture the 5A state football championship at Rice-Eccles Stadium.
