Sept. 1	MERIDIAN*	L	14-55

Tyler Berkheiser rushed for 158 yards and scored three touchdowns as Meridian built a 28-0 halftime lead and whipped Boise in the season opener for both teams. The Braves gave up on the running attack and QB Tanner Gustavsen threw 53 times. Delaney Rowe and Cameron Mayne caught TD passes. Andrew Allison didn't reach the end zone, but had nine receptions.

Sept. 9	at Vallivue*	L	26-44

Mike Burk ran for 171 yards and Vallivue's running attack chewed up huge amounts of time as the Falcons downed Boise in an SIC game. The Braves were behind early and couldn't run the ball again, so QB Tanner Gustavsen threw the ball 35 times. He completed 20 passes, including touchdown strikes to Andrew Allison and Chase Choate.

Tanner Mangum passed for 293 yards and led Eagle to 51 first-half points as the Mustangs whipped Boise in a 5A SIC game at Bronco Stadium. The Braves fell behind quickly and QB Tanner Gustavsen threw 41 of Boise's 52 plays. Gustavsen found Louis Grempe 12 times for 100 yards. Boise's defense gave up just one touchdown in the second half.

Braden Corpus passed for 175 yards and ran for 117 more and Borah's defense shut out Boise until the game's final minutes en route to an easy homecoming win. The Braves' offense had been the team's strong point, but Borah dominated time of possession. Boise's biggest play was a 47-yard throw from Tanner Gustavsen to Andrew Allison.

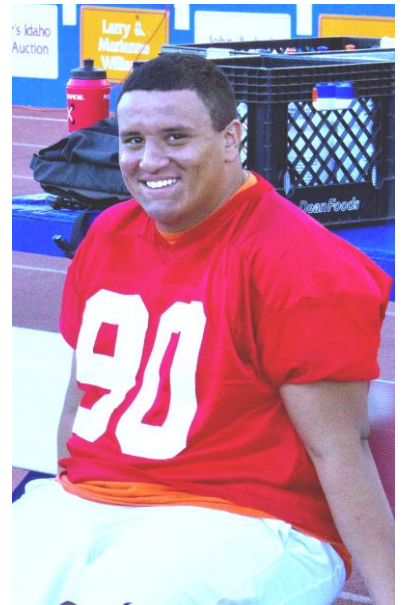
Riley Bradshaw threw for 338 yards and two touchdowns as Rocky Mountain held off Boise in the Braves' homecoming game at Bronco Stadium. The Braves trailed 20-7 at halftime, but Skyler Rowe returned the second-half kickoff 97 yards for a score and Boise rallied to tie the game. QB Tanner Gustavsen passed for 297 yards and he and Louis Grempe connected nine times.

Daniel Lau rushed for 144 yards and Kai Turner had 126 as Mountain View's line put the clamps on Boise in a 5A SIC game at Bronco Stadium. Gustavsen passed for 246 yards but was intercepted three times. Louie Grempe had another good night with eight catches for 135 yards.

Garrett Garner rushed for 119 yards and Evan Radke passed for two touchdowns as Centennial held off Boise in a 5A SIC game. The Braves had one of their better offensive efforts and held the lead on an opponent for the first time all season. Tanner Gustavsen passed for 263 yards. Matt Mello was the top rusher with 40 yards. The Braves were within 28-21 until a late touchdown by the Patriots.

Makena Simis and T. J. Clarke each rushed for over 100 yards and Capital's defense held Boise scoreless until late in the game en route to the 5A SIC victory at Bronco Stadium. Brett Walton rushed just twice, but gained a game-high 52 yards. QB Tanner Gustavsen completed 14 of 36 passes. Louie Grempp and Andrew Allison were his top receivers.

Kellen Copeland rushed for one touchdown and passed for another to help Timberline build a 20-7 lead, and the Wolves hung on to edge Boise in a cold 5A SIC game at Bronco Stadium. The Braves also blocked a punt late in the game, but couldn't get the tying – or winning – score in time.
