Gary R. Herbert

Since he became Utah's governor a few years ago Gary Herbert has been proud to claim his roots.

A member of the Orem High School Class of 1965, sports always figured prominently in his.

At Orem, he was the captain of the baseball and basketball teams. And, he was the quarterback and punter on the football team.

The governor said his favorite high school sports memory was winning the region football championship against Payson High School. Orem trailed with only a few minutes left in the game. On a 4th-and-12 play at their own 25-yard line, Herbert faked a punt, and threw a 75-yard touchdown to win the game.



LaVell Edwards

The longtime BYU football coach needs no introduction.

A graduate of Orem's Lincoln High School, where he played football and basketball, Edwards went on to assume command of BYU's then-mediocre football program in 1972 and brought it to the national limelight.

The 1974 season turned out to be the first of 27 straight non-losing seasons, and the Fiesta Bowl berth was the first of 22 consecutive post-season appearances.

In 1983, BYU finished 13-0 and beat that the next year with the school's national championship win.

Over his 29 seasons as the head coach at BYU, Edwards recorded 257 victories, ranking as the sixth all-time winningest coach in college football history.

Edwards and his wife Patti recently celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary. The Edwards have three children, Ann [Cannon], John and Jim.



Terry Peterson

Terry Peterson graduated from Orem High School in 1972. He was First Team All State and Honorable Mention All American in basketball. He played two years at Snow College and BYU.

Since his graduation, he coached the Orem High boys tennis team for three years and

supported all six of his children in their athletic pursuits at OHS.

Terry graduated from BYU with a degree in finance and is a Senior Vice President at Morgan Stanley in Provo. He married the former Sherry Sondrup, a 1973 graduate of OHS. Terry currently serves on the Alpine School District Board of Education where he represents Orem High School.
