About Skyline

Skyline High School is a public high school in Millcreek Township, a suburb southeast of Salt Lake City. The school serves students from grades 10-12. It opened in 1964 and is administered by the Granite School District.

During the 2008-09 school year, the school had 1,503 students. Admission to Skyline High School is open enrollment. Students are neither required to take an admission exam nor need to live within the boundaries set by the administering district.

Skyline is regarded by some as one of Utah's best high schools for its established student programs. Skyline's music and drama programs have received state-wide recognition. In addition, Skyline repeatedly wins Sterling Scholar awards at the state level every year. The debate program also ranks at the region and state levels. In the past five years, four Skyline students were selected as US residential scholars. Skyline also leads the state in National Merit finalists.

Skyline's sports history has rested primarily on its football prowess, as well as various individual sports (tennis, golf, swimming, etc ...). The football program peaked in the late 1990s, winning five state championships in a row (1995-1999). In 2005, the team went into the playoffs ranked fourth in the region, but won four straight games and beat rival Brighton in the state championship game.

This season marked the first year the school competed in a new region. The Eagles remained in the large school (5A) division and joined Cottonwood, Cyprus,
